

## 179. BOUTELL

1. **James<sup>1</sup> Boutwell** died in 1651, probably in Lynn, Essex County, Massachusetts. His will of 22 August 1651 was proved 26 November 1651. It names his son James, daughter Sara, wife Alice, and son John. Alice survived to present an inventory of James's estate.<sup>[1]</sup>

After 1651 virtually all of the Boutwell family were associated with Reading, Middlesex County. It has been speculated that Alice remarried there, on 5 December 1666, to William Cowdry,<sup>[2]</sup> whose first wife Joanna had died on 6 May of that year. William died "an aged man," 10 November 1687 in Reading,<sup>[3]</sup> but when his wife Alice died is unknown.

2. Lieutenant **James<sup>2</sup> Boutell** (*James<sup>1</sup>*) was born about 1642, probably in Lynn (now in Essex County), Massachusetts. He died 5 December 1716 at Reading,<sup>[6]</sup> probably in the area that later became the town of Wakefield, same county. According to his tombstone in the Old Cemetery of Wakefield, he died in his 74th year.<sup>[7]</sup> He was married at Reading, on 15 June 1665, to **Rebecca Kendall**.<sup>[8]</sup> She was born in Reading on 10 February 1644[5], daughter of Thomas and Rebecca (\_\_\_\_) Kendall,<sup>[9]</sup> died there 30 August 1713, aged 69 years,<sup>[10]</sup> and is also buried in the Old Cemetery in Wakefield.<sup>[11]</sup>

3. **James<sup>3</sup> Boutell Jr.** (*James<sup>2-1</sup>*) was born 6 April 1666 at Reading,<sup>[49]</sup> and died there 18 January 1713/4, in the 47th year of his age.<sup>[50]</sup> He is buried in the Old Cemetery in Wakefield.<sup>[51]</sup> He married in Reading, 20 January 1690/1, **Elizabeth Frothingham.**<sup>[52]</sup> She was born 15 February 1672/3 at Charlestown, Middlesex (now Suffolk) County, Massachusetts, daughter of Samuel and Ruth (George) Frothingham.<sup>[53]</sup> She outlived James and married secondly, 9 June 1714 at the Congregational Church in Reading (now Wakefield), Lt. **Benjamin Swayne.**<sup>[54]</sup> He was born in Reading on 9 September 1669, son of Maj. Jeremiah and Mary (Smith) Swayne.<sup>[55]</sup> The death dates and places of Benjamin and Elizabeth are not known.

4. Deacon **James<sup>4</sup> Boutell** (*James<sup>3-2-1</sup>*) was born 23 December 1699 in Reading.<sup>[81]</sup> He removed first to Sudbury, Middlesex County, Massachusetts, about 1724, and then to Leominster, Worcester County, where he died 22 August 1752.<sup>[82]</sup> He married in the Congregational Church in Reading (now Wakefield), on 7 February 1720/1, **Judith Poole** of Lynn.<sup>[83]</sup> She was born in Lynn on 28 January 1700/1, daughter of John and Mary (Goodwin) Poole<sup>[84]</sup> (see 359. *Poole*, 3, vi.), and died in Leominster on 28 May 1791.<sup>[85]</sup> James was known as one of the first two householders in the northern half of the New or Additional Grant in the town of Lancaster, which was set off to form the town of Leominster in 1740.<sup>[86]</sup>
