1915. BÜRCK

1. **Hans**^H **Bürck**,^[1] known as "alt" Hans to distinguish him from his son, died at Erbstetten, duchy of Württemberg, on 3 February 1680, and was buried the following day. His age was not recorded.^[2] His wife was **Eva** _____, who was born about 1620, and died on 4 March 1690, aged 70 years.^[3] She is directly identified as the mother only of Hans's three youngest children. Their origin is suggested by the baptismal record of the first of these children: "von Altkirch im Sontgau gelegen." [4] Altkirch in Sundgau is located in southern Alsace, near Schweighof. Erbstetten was ruled by the counts of Württemberg, beginning in 1453.^[5] The county became a duchy in 1495, and so remained until 1806.^[6]

- 2. **Hans Conrad**^G **Bürck**^[32] (*Hans*^H), shepherd, was born about 1650. He died at Erbstetten on 21 April 1683, aged 33 years.^[33] He married **Anna Maria** (_____) **Bacher**, called Maria, widow of Peter Bacher of Ungeheuerhof, parish of Backnang (see *1879*. *Bacher*, 1), at Erbstetten on 20 February 1672.^[34] She was born about 1640, died at Erbstetten on 3 September 1705, aged 65 years, and reportedly was survived by nine children.^[35] Ungeheuerhof was part of Württemberg since 1442.^[36]
