1. **Veltin**^K **Fallenbach**, of Neustetten in the parish of Murrhardt, duchy of Württemberg, lived at least through 1564. He is identified through the first marriages of his three daughters. Württemberg was recognized as a county until 1495, and as a duchy from 1495 until 1806. [1] Neustetten was the property of the monastery at Murrhardt as early as 1575. The village's civil jurisdiction was transferred to Kirchenkirnberg by 1809, and it was renamed "Unterneustetten" to distinguish it from "Oberneustetten," a filial of the parish of Kirchenkirnberg. [2]

- ii. Magdalena Fallenbach, m. Murrhardt 11 Jan. 1563 Hans Brenner, son of Lorentz Brenner of Vichberg. [5]
- + iii. Barbara^J Fallenbach,^[6] m. (1) Murrhardt 17 May 1564 Martin Plapp, b. say 1540, son of Wendel Plapp of Stöckenhof, parish of Murrhardt (see *3791. Plapp*, 2);^[7] as Martin's widow m. (2) Murrhardt 3 Aug. 1575 Hans Klenck of Klingen, son of the late Conrad Klenck of the same place;^[8] as Hans's widow m. (3) Murrhardt 30 Aug. 1585 Mathiß Kronmüller, son of the late Mathias Kronmüller of the Kronmühle bei Vichberg.^[9]
