

75. HANNER

1. **John¹ Hanna** died in Surry County, North Carolina, between 15 April 1793 and February 1794 (will and probate).^[1] His wife, **Martha _____**, is sometimes assigned the surname *Doak* based on the names of one son and other descendants.^[2] She survived him and was living in Sumner County, Tennessee, during the 1820 census, which was officially enumerated as of 7 August 1820.^[3]

2. **Robert² Hanner** (*John¹*), born in say 1751, as estimated from a marriage bond that he entered without parental consent, died in Guilford County, North Carolina, on 3 February 1819.^[32] He married, by bond issued 1 February 1773 in Guilford County, **Isabella Erwin**.^[33] Based on the same record, her birth date may be estimated to say 1755; she was the daughter of Robert and Martha (McClintock) Erwin. She died in Guilford County on 6 March 1816.

3. **James E.³ Hanner** (*Robert², John¹*), born 9 February 1780 apparently in Guilford County, North Carolina, died on 29 January 1851, and was buried at the Salem Methodist Church cemetery in Simpson County, Kentucky.^[47] He married first, by bond dated 2 February 1802 in Randolph County, North Carolina, **Esther Welborn** of that place,^[48] daughter of Col. John and Jane (McGee) Welborn. She died on 12 February 1815,^[49] and was buried at the cemetery known as "God's acre," at Pleasant Garden in Guilford County.^[50] He married secondly, in about 1817, to **Mary/Polly Carter**, daughter of Joseph Carter, sometimes of Sumner County, Tennessee.^[51] She died, probably in Sumner County before 7 September 1838, when she was named as deceased in her father's will.^[52] He married thirdly, by license issued in Sumner County, 20 January 1841, **Ann Anderson**.^[53] She survived him and sued for dower in Simpson County, by a petition that was initially entered in equity on 20 March 1852. By a decree issued 24 August 1852, she was ordered to receive the sum of \$120, plus costs.^[54]
