1. **Hans**^G **Heinrich**^[1] died before 1650, when named as deceased at the marriage of his daughter Barbara. He lived at Däffern in the parish of Unterweissach (now Weissach im Tal), duchy of Württemberg, ^[2] from at least 1622 to 1629, during which time he was married to **Maria Frieß**. Maria's maiden name is given in the baptism record of their daughter Catharina. It is not known whether she was the mother of any children other than the three baptized at Unterweissach, and she appears not to be otherwise documented. Däffern had come into the duchy from the former lordship of Ebersberg. The monastery at Backnang was charged with the pastoral care of its inhabitants by 1568/9.^[3]

- i. Stephan Heinrich, b. ca. 1609, bur. Unterweissach 23 Nov. 1626, aged 17y.[4]
