## 2959. INGRAHAM

1. **Richard¹ Ingraham** was granted a parcel of salt marsh in Rehoboth, New Plymouth Colony (now Bristol County, Massachusetts), in 1647.<sup>[1]</sup> Richard subsequently sold this land by an unrecorded transaction that was acknowledged by his son William in a deed of 17 May 1693. This deed names William's "father Richard Ingraham deceased."<sup>[2]</sup> William also names Jarrett Ingraham as his brother in a deed dated 29 June 1706, proving the latter's filiation.<sup>[3]</sup> The early vital records of Rehoboth also disclose two Ingraham women who married at approximately the same time as William and Jarrett. There is no documentation to directly prove that they were Richard's daughters, but there is no evidence against that proposition, and Richard appears to be the only man living in Rehoboth of an age to be their father.
