

## 1909, 7655. JEITTER

1. **Jacob<sup>1</sup> Jeitter**,<sup>[1]</sup> of Weissbuch in the parish of Oppelsbohm, duchy of Württemberg, died on 16 October 1638.<sup>[2]</sup> He was survived by his wife **Margaretha** \_\_\_\_\_, who was born about 1583 and died at Winterbach, Württemberg, on 30 March 1655, aged 72 years. The event was recorded at both Oppelsbohm and Winterbach, and both records state that she died in the household of her son-in-law (*Tochtermann*). However, the Winterbach record omits her name, and the Oppelsbohm record fails to name Hans Kaiser as her son-in-law.<sup>[3]</sup> On these grounds, Hans's wife, Anna, is believed to be Margaretha's child, but there is no other record of Anna as a child of Jacob. Jacob also has documented children who were born before 1613, the first year in which births are recorded in Weissbuch.

Württemberg was a county prior to 1495, and then a county until 1806.<sup>[4]</sup> Weissbuch was named by 1326. A separate hamlet of Hinterweissbuch was recognized in 1404, and Birkenweissbuch in 1524, when it and Vorderweissbuch were held by the monastery of Adelberg. Württemberg held the overlordship of all the monastery's lands from 1372.<sup>[5]</sup> Winterbach seems to have been under the control of the state as early as 1276.<sup>[6]</sup>

A child of Margaretha, possibly not by Jacob<sup>1</sup> Jeitter, is:

Adam Reylin of Mittelschlechtbach, and widow of Hans Krauter, *Schultheiß*,<sup>[39]</sup> inhabitant of Schlechtbach, d. after 2 Oct. 1656.<sup>[40]</sup>

2. **Thomas<sup>H</sup> Jeitter**<sup>[41]</sup> (*Jacob*<sup>1</sup>), of Buhlbronn in the parish of Oppelsbohm, was born at Weissbuch 30 July 1620. The sponsor at his baptism was M. Thomas Rommel, pastor.<sup>[42]</sup> He died an inhabitant of Buhlbronn, and was buried at Oppelsbohm on 2 February 1699, aged 80 years.<sup>[43]</sup> He married **Maria Kurtz** in Buhlbronn in 1646.<sup>[44]</sup> She was born at Buhlbronn on 26 April 1618, daughter of Jacob and Maria (\_\_\_\_) (Besler) Kurtz (see 7629, 7637. *Kurtz*, 1. c. ii.). The sponsor at her baptism was Taudt Burkh of Schorndorf.<sup>[45]</sup> She is recorded as the mother of his first four children, and she was likely the mother of the stillborn fifth child as well.<sup>[46]</sup> Buhlbronn was ruled by Württemberg from 1411.<sup>[47]</sup>

3. **Jerg<sup>G</sup> Jeitter**<sup>[62]</sup> (*Thomas<sup>H</sup>, Jacob<sup>I</sup>*), of Buhlbronn, was born at Buhlbronn on 7 March 1656. The sponsors at his baptism were Michael Kropf, of Krehwinkel, and Catharina, the wife of the pastor.<sup>[63]</sup> He was living at Buhlbronn on 23 June 1705, when his daughter Maria was married.<sup>[64]</sup> He married **Maria Fritz** on 18 July 1680 at Buhlbronn.<sup>[65]</sup> She was born at Buhlbronn on 27 January 1655, daughter of Martin and Ursula (Heberlin) Fritz (see 3809, 3819. *Fritz*, 2, vii.), and her baptism was sponsored by Catharina, wife of Peter Möll.<sup>[66]</sup> When Maria died is not known, but she is recorded as the mother of Jerg's children. Perhaps Jerg was married secondly to Eva \_\_\_\_, who died as a widow of Jerg Jeitter at Buhlbronn on 24 January 1730, aged 73 years.
