

1891. KOLB

1. **Andreas¹ Kolb** was a Roman Catholic inhabitant of “Herlighofen.”^[1] Within the subsequent boundaries of the kingdom of Württemberg there were several places of a similar name, but the nearest match, on both the pronunciation of the name and its distance from Alfdorf, where his sons came to live, seems to be Herlikofen, which originally belonged to the Hohenstaufen kingdom, but came under the sole authority of the lordship of Gmünd in 1557. There had been a Catholic parish there since 1372,^[2] but parish records seem to begin only in 1675.

Children of Andreas¹ Kolb include:

- i. HANS KOLB,^[3] b. 1624,^[4] inhabitant of Alfdorf d. 22 Nov. 1686,^[5] m. 27 Aug. 1645 BARBARA STEINER, b. 1630, dau. of Christoph and Anna (____) Steiner of Alfdorf,^[6] inhabitant of Alfdorf, d. 22 Feb. 1689.^[7]
- ii. CHRISTOPH^H KOLB, b. 1631, d. after 1699, m. ANNA MARIA LANG.

2. **Christoph^H Kolb^[8]** (*Andreas¹*), of Alfdorf, Württemberg, was born in 1631. He seems to have lived at Alfdorf at least through 1699, when he was enumerated in the Lutheran church census of that parish—on the same page as his son-in-law Jacob Baÿ. The census reports that Christoph was married in November 1656 in Hohenstatt, Württemberg, to **Anna Maria Lang**. She was born in 1627, the daughter of Jerg and Elisabetha (____) Lang of München, Kingdom of Bavaria, and died on 11 May 1691.^[9] There was more than one place of a name similar to Hohenstatt within the future boundaries of the kingdom of Württemberg, but the place of their marriage could be the one in the Lutheran parish of Sulzdorf, which was administered by the council (*Rath*) of Hall from 1503.^[10] Although Christoph and Anna Maria were identified as Roman Catholic (*Pontific.*), the births of their children were recorded in the Lutheran baptismal register

of Alfdorf. The state administration of the parish was divided at one time, but Württemberg seems to have assumed full jurisdiction over the village court by 1566.^[11]

Alfdorf 22 Jan. 1659, son of Jacob and Anna (Weller) Baÿ (see 945. *Baÿ*, 3), sp. Jacob Schuelin and wife Anna of Alfdorf,^[18] d. Alfdorf 11 Nov. 1713, aged 54y.^[19]
- iii. JOHANNES KOLB, b. 1 June 1662, sp. Johann Pleickard Krafft and wife Elisabetha,^[20] m. (1) Stuttgart, Württemberg, 26 July 1686 ANNA JULIANA ROTHACKER, dau. of Hans Jacob Rothacker of Stuttgart,^[21] b. ca. 1668, d. Stuttgart 7, bur. 9 Jun 1696, aged 28y;^[22] m. (2) Stuttgart 23 Nov. 1697 MARIA AGNES SCHUSTER, dau. of the late Johann Schuster of Grosssachsenheim,^[23] b. ca. 1659, d. Stuttgart 23, bur. 26 Dec. 1711, aged 52y;^[24] m. (3) Stuttgart 8 Nov. 1712 EUPHROSINA FINNINGER, dau. of Samuel Finninger of Waibelinger.^[25]
- iv. ANNA MARIA KOLB, b. 26 Oct. 1664, sp. Johann Pleickardt Krafft and wife Elisabetha,^[26] m. Alfdorf 10 Nov. 1691 JERG HINDERER,^[27] b. 4 April 1670, son of Michael and Ursula (Maÿer) Hinderer of Adelstetten, parish of Alfdorf.^[28]
- v. GOTTFRIED CHRISTOPH KOLB, b. 16 Sept. 1670, sp. H. Gottfried von Holtz and wife Barbara Sybilla, and H. Joh. Pl. Crafft and wife Elisabetha.^[29]
