## 729. NEWMAN

Further details on the biography of Richard<sup>A</sup> Newman, and the composition of both his family and his son Samuel's, are in Austin W. Spencer, "Samuel<sup>1</sup> Newman of Dorchester and Weymouth, Massachusetts, and Rehoboth, Plymouth Colony, His Origin and Early Career," *New England Historical and Genealogical Register* 176 (2022): 259-72. Only the essential chronological statements for these generations are repeated here.

1. Richard <sup>A</sup> Newman, shoemaker, was buried at Banbury, Oxfordshire, England, on 25 March
1619.[1] He married Elizabeth () Sheldrick, possibly by the ceremony performed at St. Mary
Magdalene, Bermondsey, Surrey, England, 24 October 1594.[2] Richard named her and her son,
Richard Sheldrick, in his will, dated 18 February 1618/9.[3] Elizabeth was buried as a widow at
Banbury on 25 August 1641.[4] She is presumed also to be the mother of all of Richard New-
man's children. His eldest son, John (bp. 1595), named Elizabeth as his mother in his own will.[5]
Children of Richard <sup>A</sup> and Elizabeth ( ) (Sheldrick) Newman include:

- 2. i. Samuel<sup>1</sup> Newman, bp. 24 May 1602, d. 5 July 1663, m. Sybil Featley.
- 2. Reverend **Samuel¹ Newman** (*Richard*<sup>A</sup>) was baptized 24 May 1602 at Banbury, Oxfordshire, England, [6] and died 5 July 1663 at Rehoboth, New Plymouth Colony (now Bristol County, Massachusetts). [7] He was married in England, reportedly at Banbury either on 25 December 1623 or 10 June 1624, to **Sybil Featley**, but this is not of record in the Banbury parish register. Sybil reportedly was born 8 April or 21 November 1604, perhaps in Oxfordshire. [8] She was buried 2 November 1672 at Rehoboth. [9]

Children of Rev. Samuel<sup>1</sup> and Sybil (Featley) Newman include:

- 3. i. Antipas Newman, b. 15 Oct. "1627" [1629?], d. 15 Oct. 1672, m. Elizabeth Winthrop.
- 3. Reverend **Antipas**<sup>2</sup> **Newman** (*Samuel*<sup>1</sup>, *Richard*<sup>A</sup>) was reportedly was born 15 October 1627 at Midhope, in the parish of Ecclesfield in the West Riding of Yorkshire.<sup>[10]</sup> This date appears to be

in conflict with an otherwise unrecorded child of his father, a daughter Hannah who was baptized at Bradfield, Yorkshire, 28 October 1627.<sup>[11]</sup> Perhaps Antipas's birth date may be adjusted to 1629, to accommodate the birth of his next younger brother, Noah, in 1631/2.<sup>[12]</sup> Antipas died at Wenham, Essex County, Massachusetts, on 15 October 1672,<sup>[13]</sup> having married there, on 10 November 1658, **Elizabeth Winthrop**.<sup>[14]</sup> She was born 24 July 1636 in Boston, Massachusetts,<sup>[15]</sup> daughter of Gov. John (Jr.) and Elizabeth (Reade) Winthrop.<sup>[16]</sup> After the death of her first husband, she married **Zerubbabel Endicott**, reportedly in 1678.<sup>[17]</sup> They were certainly married by 2 December 1680, when "Elizabeth Endicott formerly widow of Mr. Antipas Newman" entered an estate petition.<sup>[18]</sup> Zerubbabel was born in 1635 and died in 1684,<sup>[19]</sup> son of Gov. John and Elizabeth (Gibson) Endicott.<sup>[20]</sup> She died as his widow on 7 December 1716 at Boston, by then in Suffolk County, Massachusetts.<sup>[21]</sup>

vii. WAITSTILL NEWMAN (son), b. 13 Dec. 1671 or 6 Jan. 1671[/2], aged 1y on 29 March 1673.

4. Doctor **John**<sup>3</sup> **Newman** (*Antipas*<sup>2</sup>, *Samuel*<sup>1</sup>, *Richard*<sup>A</sup>) was born at Wenham on 10 September 1660, according to the county record, on 7 December 1660, according to an entry in his father's probate records, dated 29 March 1673. He died 2 January 1719/20 in Gloucester, Essex County, Massachusetts, aged about 59 years. He married there, on 13 December 1683, **Ruth Emerson**. She was born there on 28 August 1660, daughter of Rev. John and Ruth (Symonds) Emerson. It was likely she, and not her daughter Ruth, who as "Mrs. Ruth Newman" married **Samuel Sargent** on 29 June 1725 at Gloucester. This couple has neither children's births nor death dates recorded in this town.
