

14891. SCHUPP

1. **Bastian^J Schupp** of Württembergerhof, parish of Mainhardt, in the eventual kingdom of Württemberg,^[1] died before 23 August 1580. On that date his widow, **Genova** _____, was remarried to Alexander Schupp, son of Lienhardt Schupp of the Hohenstraße in the same parish.^[2] It is not known whether Genova was the mother of Bastian's children. In 1528, Württembergerhof was made up of three settlements, one of which passed with Hankertsmühle.^[3] In 1528, as in 1580, Hankertsmühle was held of the lordship of Limpurg-Gaildorf, but Mainhardt was held of Hohenlohe. Whether any one lord was sovereign over the entire Württembergerhof during this time is unclear.^[4]
