

## 7627. SIGLIN

1. **Hans<sup>I</sup> Siglin**,<sup>[1]</sup> “senior,” of Ödernhardt in the parish of Oppelsbohm, duchy of Württemberg, died between 10 July 1631, when his daughter Catharina was married, and 1637. His only recorded wife was **Margretha** \_\_\_\_, called Gretha prior to 1637, but she is not recorded as the mother of all of his children. On the third Sunday after Epiphany [22 January] 1637 at Ödernhardt, Margretha was married to **Samuel Dill**.<sup>[2]</sup> Ödernhardt is first named in 1428. The area belonged to the civil district (*Amt*) of Winnenden under the county of Württemberg from 1326,<sup>[3]</sup> which became a duchy from 1495 to 1806.<sup>[4]</sup>

A child of Hans<sup>I</sup> Siglin, possibly not by Margretha, is:

- i. CATHARINA SIGLIN,<sup>[5]</sup> m. Ödernhardt 10 July 1631 JACOB SCHWARTZ, son of the late Leonhardt Schwartz of Birkmannsweiler;<sup>[6]</sup> both inhabitants of Ödernhardt, 23 Oct. 1634.<sup>[7]</sup>

- iii. MARGRETHA SIGLIN,<sup>[14]</sup> as Gretha b. 28 March 1619, sp. Brigitha, wife of Erhardt Kopf of Oppelsbohm,<sup>[15]</sup> d. Geradstetten 8, bur. 10 April 1690, aged 65y [sic],<sup>[16]</sup> m. (1) Ödernhardt 14 May 1650 JACOB KLÖPPER,<sup>[17]</sup> b. Birkmannsweiler, parish of Winnenden, 12 May 1630, son of Hans<sup>I</sup> Jacob and
