

469. VEIL

1. **Johann Michael^F Veil** of Erbstetten, duchy of Württemberg,^[1] usually called Michael, was born about 1653, and died on 24 September 1729 at Erbstetten, aged 76 years.^[2] He is otherwise known only from his children's marriage records, some of which call Michael a *Bestandmaier*. Erbstetten had belonged to Württemberg since 1453.^[3]

Erbstetten 23 July 1693, son of Georg and Anna Barbara (Kübler) Kübler (see 1889. *Kübler*, 2, ix.), sp. Philipp Blind, and Catharina, wife of Joseph Kurtz.^[6]
2. ii. JOHANN LEONHARD^E VEIL, b. ca. 1683, d. 20 June 1753, m. EVA ACKERMANN.
- iii. CHRISTINA VEIL,^[7] b. say 1685, d. Erbstetten 18 Sept. 1735,^[8] m. Erbstetten 27 May 1715 JOHANN MARTIN KÜBLER,^[9] bp. Erbstetten 7 Dec. 1690, son of Leonhard and Anna Maria (Kleinknecht) Kübler, sp. Georg Ackermann and Anna Maria wife of Michael Freytag,^[10] likely the Martin Kübler who d. Erbstetten 12 May 1743.^[11]

2. **Johann Leonhard^E Veil** (*Johann Michael^F*), of Erbstetten, was born about 1683, and was buried at Erbstetten on 20 June 1753, aged 70 years.^[12] He married **Eva Ackermann** at Erbstetten on 27 April 1717.^[13] She was baptized at Erbstetten on 2 March 1691, daughter of Christian and Maria (Bacher) Ackermann (see 939, 3779. *Ackermann*, 5, iii.). Sponsors at her baptism were Joseph

Kübler and Margaretha, the wife of Philipp Blind.^[14] Eva died at Erbstetten on 26 May 1766, aged 75 years and 2 months. She was buried on 29 May 1766.^[15]

Unterweissach 29 April 1760 GOTTLIEB ULMER, widower of Unterdresselhof,^[36] as his second wife,^[37] b. Steinbach, parish of Backnang, 8 Nov. 1729, son of Johannes and Anna Maria (Kintzer) Ulmer, sp. Joh. Georg Oppenländer and wife Anna Barbara of Steinbach,^[38] inhabitant of Unterdresselhof, d. 3, bur. 5 Feb. 1803, aged 73y 3m.^[39]
